# About the Nebraska Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence

The Nebraska Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence (Nebraska Coalition) is a statewide membership organization committed to the prevention and elimination of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The Coalition's primary purpose is to provide support to the 20 community-based domestic violence/sexual assault programs in Nebraska. To this effort, the Coalition provides the following:

- Statewide, regional and local training for program staff and volunteers;
- A comprehensive resource library for use by the programs and public;
- Sponsorship of statewide educational campaigns;
- Public education and training to help ensure that public laws and policies support victims and survivors and hold offenders accountable.

In addition, the Coalition funds the Línea de Crisis, the statewide hotline in Spanish for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Another Coalition program, Josie's Fund, helps victims of violence pay for pet-related expenses such as kenneling or veterinarian bills.

# **Services We Provide**

Nebraska's network of domestic violence/sexual assault programs is designed to provide emergency services, information and assistance to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault. Although services vary throughout the state, each program provides access to the following types of assistance.

#### 24-Hour Crisis Line

Confidential support, information and referral to services are available 24 hours each day by calling the local crisis line of the program in your area (see listing on following page).

## **Emergency Shelter**

Providing a safe place to stay is an important service of Nebraska's network of programs. Using a combination of shelters and motels, programs offer victims and survivors a safe place to stay to escape further violence.

#### Transportation

Emergency transportation to shelter, court proceedings, medical services or other community agencies when needed is available through each program.

#### Medical Advocacy & Referrals

Program staff and volunteers can accompany survivors to hospitals and local medical officesormeetthemtheretoprovidesupportandinformationwhen survivors are treated for injuries or receive rape examinations.

## Assistance with Protection Orders & Legal Referrals

Programs can assist survivors with obtaining a domestic abuse protection order, offer emotional support through court hearings, and provide referrals to local attorneys. Programs cannot give legal advice.

## **On-Going Support & Information**

Support groups for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault and for adult survivors of child sexual abuse and incest are available in many communities. Some programs also offer groups for teens experiencing violence, for children who are exposed to domestic and sexual violence, and for people who batter.

## **Education & Prevention Programs**

Programs provide presentations to schools, civic groups, churches and other organizations on a variety of issues related to domestic violence and sexual assault. They also provide trainings for other area agencies who work with survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault.
