Sexual Assault Facts and Myths

Sexual assault is any unwanted sexual contact or behavior that happens when a person is coerced, forced or manipulated into the activity. This can mean rape, child sexual abuse, intimate partner violence, and groping. Those that do sexually assault others do so to assert power and control over someone that can leave lasting emotional and physical trauma. It is always important to not that this serious crime is never the victim's fault. Her are some facts and myths regarding sexual assault.

Myth: Only women can be sexually assaulted.

Fact: Both men and women are sexually assaulted and the offender can be any gender, and of any sexual orientation. According to the Statista Research Department there were 406,970 female victims and 52,336 male victims of sexual assault or rape in 2019.

Myth: Women often falsely accuse men of sexual assault to get attention.

Fact: Most sexual assault reports are honest. According to the National Sexual Violence Resource Center only 2-10% of sexual assaults that are reported are false accusations. Many survivors of sexual assault do not report for fear of not being believed and scared of what the offender might do.

Myth: It's not sexual assault if you are a couple or married.

Fact: Unwanted sexual activity or behavior in any relationship is assault. About 8 in 10 victims of sexual assault knew their attacker whether that is a friend, spouse, family member, or coworker. The National Institute of Justice also states that due to this there becomes a failure to report which causes the general public and law enforcement to underestimate the extent of the problem.

Myth: If you are drunk or wearing revealing clothing, you are partially responsible.

Fact: Victims are never, under any circumstances, responsible or at fault for somebody choosing to assault them.

Sexual assault can affect victims in many ways including being in shock or denial, feeling afraid, silent, anxious, depressed, guilty and isolated. It can affect their confidence and cause them to have PTSD and flashbacks from the situation. In the past year, there has been a decrease in reporting due to Covid-19 restrictions and mandates. This, however, does not mean sexual assault or domestic violence has decreased but that victims feel trapped and are not in a safe environment to get help. HAVEN HOUSE RECEIVES \$20,000 GRANT FROM MARY KAY FOUNDATION

Haven House Family Services Center received a \$20,000 Domestic Violence Shelter Grant from the Mary Kay Foundation. Debbie Goettsch, Interim Director of Haven House, is grateful that the agency has received this grant twice in the past three years. Each year, The Mary Kay Foundation awards a grant to at least one domestic violence shelter in every state that applies. Any remaining funds are distributed based on state population. Applications are reviewed and recommended by the Domestic Violence Shelter Grant Committee.

The donation to Haven House will improve the safety features and layout of the South Sioux satellite office and allow the agency to help more clients.

Kim Halle, a local Mary Kay Ambassador, regularly visits Haven House with products and samples for the staff and clients. One of her clients described how Haven House helped her escape domestic violence. "They provided the needs of the heart to promote healing. She is eternally grateful to the women of Haven House for their resources, services, and kindness." Halle's describes Haven House as a refuge for her client's family.

Connie Reyes, SA/DV Supervisor, says the Mary Kay Foundation Domestic Violence Shelter Grants have been instrumental in updating and replacing safety items in our shelters. Haven House provided services for 340 clients and answered 1302 crisis calls during the last fiscal year. Our two shelters hosted 39 clients who stayed for a total of 790 nights

HEALTHY and HAPPY HOUR AT WAYNE STATE COLLEGE

Haven House participated in the Healthy and Happy Hour sponsored by WSC Student Health and Counseling Center. The event aims to brings different groups together to promote physical and mental wellbeing with a positive message. 
