QUALIFICATIONS

To be qualified for Transitional Housing, a participant must be:

- ◇ A survivor of domestic violence, sexual assault, sex trafficking, or stalking
 - ◇ Currently residing in Haven House shelter
 - ◇ Nineteen (19) years old or (legally) emancipated minor
 - ◇ Able to have an income (can be from a variety of sources)
 - ◇ Able to find housing and sign a lease
 - ◇ Able to pay 30% of income on rent
 - ◇ Work towards a plan to pay for all expenses after the 24 month period
 - ◇ Committed to seeking a healthy, nonviolent lifestyle
 - ◇ Ready to separate self from abusive relationships
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- * Clients will be responsible for any damages.
 - * Problems with appliances, structural issues, or concerns should be directed to the landlord or property manager.
 - * Clients will be expected to maintain a clean and safe living space.

GOALS

The goal of Transitional Housing Program is to assist clients in attaining safe and affordable housing, emotional health, and the development of safe and healthy lifestyles for independent living, and economic self-sufficiency as they prepare to move into permanent housing.

We will seek to meet these goals by offering advocacy services, employment assistance, counseling, legal service advocacy, children's services, and support groups.
