January is Stalking Awareness Month

We all know that lyric from Adele's song *Hello*, and we've probably sung along to it not thinking twice about how ridiculous it sounds to call someone a thousand times. Many of us don't know enough about stalking to recognize the behaviors or understand how dangerous it can actually be. But the reality is scary: young people between the ages of 18-24 experience the highest rate of stalking. Stalking is a crime in all 50 states. Unlike other crimes, stalking is not a single, easily identifiable crime, but a series of acts, a course of conduct directed at a specific person that cause that person fear.

Stalking Awareness and Cyberstalking

- In the United States 7.5 million people are stalked in any given year.
- Of these, 1 in 4 victims are stalked over the internet.
- 46% of all stalking victims experience at least one unwanted contact per week.
- Nearly 3 in 4 stalking victims know their offender.

How cyberstalking works

Cyberstalking is a term that refers to the misuse of the internet or technology to stalk and harass someone. Individuals who obsess over others now have dozens of convenient online means by which to follow their prey such as e-mail, social media, messaging apps, or through online spaces and websites.

How to prevent cyberstalking

- 1. Know that anybody could be a potential victim of cyberstalking.
- 2. Take advantage of privacy settings; make your social media accounts private.
- 3. Don't post personal information on social media.
- 4. Be wary of emails, texts, and calls that ask for personal information.
- 5. Don't share your passwords with anyone.
- 6. Monitor your children's internet activity.

What to do if you think you are being stalked?

1)Trust your instincts. 2)Tell somebody you trust. 3)Keep documentation of all contact from the stalker. 4)Report it to the authorities.
