NENCAP Programs/Services

Health

<u>Traveling Clinics</u> offer a variety of health services in a one-stop-shop approach.

Early Development Network Services
Coordination helps families with infants or
children age 0 to 3 who have a disability
and who qualify for special education in the
Norfolk Public School System.

NENCAP Home Visitation is a parent support program for families with children through the age of eight. Parents can learn about positive discipline, social emotional and cognitive development and benefits of good physical and emotional health. This program is based on the wants and needs of each individual family. The program is at no cost to families and open to everyone regardless of income.

The Immunization Program provides vaccines to adults and children age 18 and under by following the recommended schedule from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services and the Center for Disease Control. Immunizations are given by a licensed Nurse and a Physician is on call for each clinic. No VFC eligible child is denied immunizations for inability to pay. Please call for information on private vaccines and insurance billing, as well as determination of VFC eligibility.

Food And Nutrition

<u>Commodity Supplemental Food Program</u> (<u>CSFP</u>) provides nutrition education and food to adults who are age 60 and over. There are several distribution sites across the service area.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) provides nutrition education and special foods to women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or who have recently had a baby and/or have infants and children (including foster children). There are several WIC clinics held across the service area.

Education

Head Start is a federally funded program committed to providing comprehensive services for children and families. The program promotes school readiness through preschool services for three and four year olds. Children enhance their cognitive, language, literacy, physical and social emotional development through experiences in quality early childhood environments.

Support Services

Family Services provides a majority of support services for the agency. This program promotes client self-sufficiency through a variety of programs including:

- Housing and case management for Veterans
- Emergency rent and utility assistance
- Budgeting and financial literacy education
- Case management
- Free income tax preparation assistance
- Food pantries
- Child safety seat installation and education
- SSI/SSDI Outreach, Access, and Recovery (SOAR) is designed to increase access to the disability income benefit programs.
- Marketplace Navigator Program assists families and individuals enrolling in health insurance under the Affordable Care Act. Navigators are available to assist families, individuals and small businesses purchasing health insurance coverage through the federally operated Health Insurance Marketplace.

Housing

Weatherization helps alleviate the ever increasing costs of heating and cooling homes of Nebraska's low income residents. It is a long term solution to the high costs of heating consumption, both to individuals and the environment. Eligible low income participants include renters, as well as, homeowners.
